The Koger Center is located on Capital Circle S.E. just south of Old St. Augustine Rd. The shuttles will load on the side of the Hartman Building facing Capital Circle. StarMetro will not permit any coolers larger than 12-quarts to be carried on the buses. NOTE: StarMetro will ONLY pick up and drop off passengers at the Koger Center and at Tom Brown Park. No exceptions.
