According to the statistics presented in December, crime continues to be down by 13 percent compared to last year. In October, Tallahassee experienced an 8.6 percent decrease in violent crime and a 6.7 percent decrease in property crime. At the time of publication, final data for 2017 was still being compiled.

To further support the efforts of TPD, the Commission recently voted to approve more than \$315,000 in grant funding. With this additional funding, TPD will further boost safety and deter crime through equipment upgrades and enhanced technology, including purchasing safety cameras.

The first set of safety cameras, which were installed in the Bond neighborhood, have had a positive impact in the area. TPD has received only one call for service at a nearby store in the first two-week period compared to 15 calls the two weeks prior to installation.

A list of camera locations can be found at Talgov.com/safetycameras. Following a review of citizen complaint data, crime statistics and community feedback, 10 additional cameras are being installed.

Community engagement continues to play a key role in enhancing public safety. Citizens are encouraged to take part in neighborhood watch programs and report suspicious activity by calling 891-4200. If citizens wish to remain anonymous, they may call Crime Stoppers at (850) 574-TIPS. For emergency situations, call 9-1-1.

Many people increase their spending during the holiday season and then button up their wallets at the beginning of the new year. Even the most conservative spenders though will still be making purchases. When you do, consider where you are shopping and where your dollars go.

When you shop at local businesses, more of your money stays in the local area. Studies by research firm Civic Economics, show that on average, 48 percent of each purchase at local independent businesses was recirculated locally, compared to less than 14 percent of purchases at chain stores.

Michael H. Shuman, author of the book *Going Local*, provides one of the best explanations for why people should shop local. "Going local does not mean walling off the outside world. It means nurturing locally owned businesses which use local resources sustainably, employ local workers at decent wages and serve primarily local consumers. It means becoming more self-sufficient and less dependent on imports. Control moves from the boardrooms of distant corporations and back into the community where it belongs."

Beyond the economic impacts, local businesses are frequently one of the biggest contributing factors to a city's overall sense of place. From Seattle to Miami, you can shop at the same chain stores, but one-of-a-kind purveyors and friendly service providers are the elements that make a community unique. From restaurants and roofers to tattoo shops and tailors, there are a wide variety of locally owned businesses ready to serve you.

Avoid Frozen Water Pipes

When temperatures dip extremely low, be sure to take measures to prevent frozen water pipes from bursting. Water expands when it freezes. When water pipes freeze, the expanding water can break the pipe, and you can be left with a thoroughly soaked house when those pipes thaw. Here's some advice for those nights when a hard freeze is likely - about 30 degrees (F) or below for more than one hour.

- Trickle cold water from one or more faucets
- Insulate all exposed outside water pipes and faucets
- Make sure the cover to your water meter fits tightly
- Wrap or cover exposed outdoor pipes.

When pipes break between the water meter and the home or within the home, the customer is responsible for repairs. City of Tallahassee Utilities repairs any damage to pipes between the water main under the street and the meter or in the main itself.

Can You See Me Now?

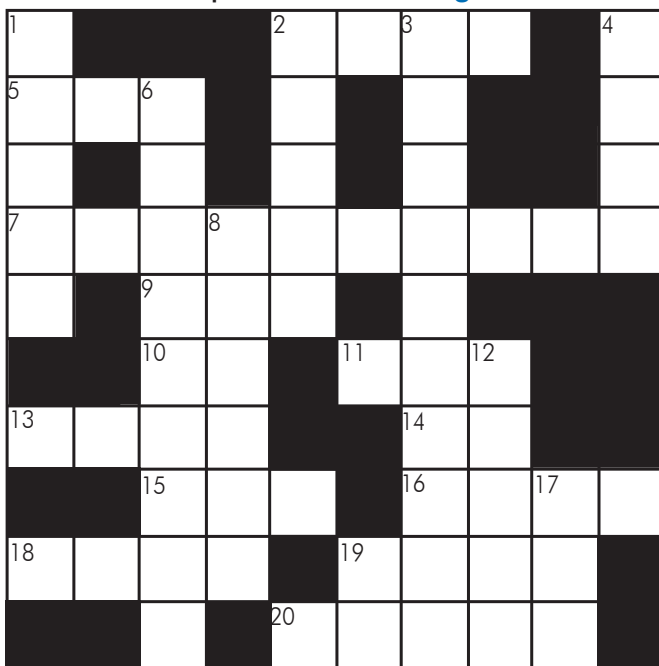
